2019 MCC Charities Providing Support to Communities Impacted by Hurricane Dorian

Funds will be distributed to these nonprofits in 2020. Your donation will help these organizations meet the ongoing, long-term recovery needs of communities impacted by Hurricane Dorian.

American Red Cross, Central Maryland Chapter (*American Red Cross of the Greater Chesapeake Region*)

MCC Code/EIN: 53-0196605

On the ground supporting families in the US affected by Hurricane Dorian since late August. Continuing to support cleanup efforts by providing warm meals, relief supplies, immediate financial support and mental health and spiritual counseling.

Americares

MCC Code/EIN: 06-1008595

Deployed an emergency medical team to the Bahamas to meet the immediate health needs of families left homeless by the Hurricane. Provided primary care services and lifesaving medicines in a Nassau evacuation shelter housing more than 400 children and adults from the most devastated areas, including the Abaco and Grand Bahama islands, since 9/12.

The Anglican Relief and Development Fund

Collecting funds to partner with Water Missions to provide clean water for Hurricane Dorian victims.

Baltimore Community ToolBank

MCC Code/EIN: 45-4507134

Sent pallets of tools to the Bahamas. Mobile units are poised to deploy domestically in partnership with other responders for long-term recovery efforts.

Best Friends Animal Society

MCC Code/EIN: 23-7147797

Provided assistance with animal transport, financial aid, and supplies. Focused on stateside needs, but are prepared to help animals coming from the Bahamas.

Church World Service

MCC Code/EIN: 13-4080201

Prepared for early response in the US with Emergency Cleanup Buckets, Blankets Hygiene Kits and School Kits. Engaging with partners on the ground to help ensure that our most vulnerable neighbors have the care and support needed to recover over the longer term.

Food for the Hungry

MCC Code/EIN: 95-2680390

Working through partners to provide emergency supplies such as clean water, hygiene items and food for affected populations. As of 9/11, partner Water Mission has established a clean water Reverse Osmosis system in Green Turtle Cay, with another positioned in Marsh Harbor on 9/14, and 20,000 meals a day are being distributed by World Central Kitchen in Abaco and Grand Bahama.

International Aid, Inc.

MCC Code/EIN: 38-2323350

Shipped a 20' container of health and cleaning supplies (hygiene kits, soap, and toothbrushes) for Bahamian families. Assessing how best to provide resources our partners need as they continue to respond to this disaster.

International Medical Corps

MCC Code/EIN: 95-3949646

Continuing to work with the Bahamian Ministry of Health (MoH), in coordination with the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) and World Health Organization (WHO), to lead assessment efforts on Grand Bahama island and provide medical care in the hard-hit central and eastern parts of the island, from Freeport in the west through McLean's Town in the east.

International Relief Teams

MCC Code/EIN: 33-0412751

Will send 25 containers (40' sea containers) of disaster relief supplies that include water, ready-to-eat meals, canned goods, tarps, blankets, household items, camping gear, and hygiene kits to the Bahamas over the next five weeks. With your help, ensuring the victims of Hurricane Dorian who lost everything will have the essentials they need to survive, and prevent any further loss of life.

Lab Rescue LRCP

MCC Code/EIN: 52-1880024

In advance of Dorian, rescued fifteen dogs in low-lying areas of North Carolina to ensure those dogs' safety and to help make space in the shelters for owned dogs who might lose their homes. The dogs rescued were provided with veterinary care and a foster home prior to adoption.

MAP International

MCC Code/EIN: 36-2586390

2,660 Disaster Health Kits (DHKs) and 200 Sawyer water filters airlifted to the Bahamas by partners, Sol Relief and Project Hope, and DHKs provided for 100 foster children evacuating Brunswick, GA, from the Morningstar Youth Estate Campus. Packing a freight container with essential medicines and health supplies to be airlifted to the Bahamas.

Matthew 25: Ministries

Mercy Corps

Reached the Bahamas and rushed to help survivors and meet the needs of families and communities affected by this devastating storm. Thousands of homes have been destroyed and entire communities are under water.

Mission Aviation Fellowship

Sent four team members to partner with Samaritan's Purse and Missionary Flight International to deliver emergency supplies to impacted islands and transport aid workers and patients.

Pan American Development Foundation

MCC Code/EIN: 52-6054268

Supported the distribution of 149,688 bottles of water, 400 generators, 248 plastic tarps, and 500 handheld flashlights, in addition to 114,400 diapers and 800 rolls of toilet paper through our partnership with Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines (RCCL) and HeadKnowles. Supporting fundraising efforts by collecting donations on behalf of Royal Caribbean Cruises Ltd. (RCCL), the American Chambers of Commerce in Trinidad and Tobago, and the Caribbean Desalination Association.

Project HOPE

MCC Code/EIN: 53-0242962

Initial response team, including volunteer medical personnel, arrived on Sept. 6 and is committed to providing health care and humanitarian assistance where it is needed most. Activated our roster for medical volunteers for additional deployments and are working with partners to coordinate shipments of health and hygiene supplies.

Rise Against Hunger

MCC Code/EIN: 16-1541024

Distributing 142,000+ Rise Against Hunger meals, 17,000 bars of soap and 400 hygiene kits to Grand Bahama and Abaco Island. Worked around the clock alongside our partners to determine a swift response plan.

Semper Fi Fund

MCC Code/EIN: 26-0086305

Assisting service members and their families that have been affected by Hurricane Dorian. Providing lodging, food, and gas cards to displaced families, as well as assisting with home repairs.

Senior Dog Sanctuary of Maryland Inc.

MCC Code/EIN: 47-3708109

Providing direct financial support to animal rescue and recovery efforts in the Bahamas, to include relocation for veterinary care and re-homing. Funds raised are used to pay for and transport veterinary essentials to the islands and help with the costs of domestic animal evacuation.

The Salvation Army World Service Office

MCC Code/EIN: 13-2923701

One of only two charitable organizations that the Bahamas Government highlighted as organizations for the general public to channel their contributions through. Immediate assistance has been to provide the essentials: food, water, clothing, personal hygiene supplies and shelter first on the islands of Grand Bahama and Abaco, and now sheltering and supporting evacuees in Nassau.

UNICEF USA

MCC Code/EIN: 13-1760110

Teams are working with the government and other UN agencies to ease the devastating impact on the tens of thousands of children and families whose homes and communities have been leveled. Water and sanitation experts along with emergency and child protection specialists are now on the ground, assessing the needs and planning the response.

World Emergency Relief

MCC Code/EIN: 95-4014743

Already shipped 54 tons of emergency supplies to Grand Bahama and Abaco Islands including food, water, hygiene, and other basic relief items, including clean-up supplies and toys, but much more is needed. Will continue to respond with urgently needed food, diapers and cleaning supplies – and when the time comes, we will be there to help rebuild homes and lives.

World Renew

UMCOR has awarded a solidarity grant to Bahamas Methodist Habitat for immediate, emergency short-term funding to address basic human needs. At this stage, donations to UMCOR are the best way for church members to respond.

World Vision

Truckloads of relief supplies are being shipped to partner organizations in Daytona Beach and Immokalee to be ready for distribution to hard-hit areas. During and after a crisis, World Vision supports local churches in their outreach to families, not only in the short-run but also through the arduous process of rebuilding homes and lives.
